## You may want to know!

: **Call first**.....We are predominantly a mail order/order and pick up operation, and encourage our customers to call ahead or place orders before stopping out: We do not have staff on site for walk in sales.

:All stock, including large shade trees (but excluding balled conifers) are dug as bare-root and sold while stock is still dormant. Planting bare-root stock has proven to be an excellent way to handle these large and small hard-wood trees. They show excellent survival, save time and money, not to mention a lot of backaches.

: We buy or collect most of our seed from the central forests of Wisconsin, this ensures that you are getting (hardy to zone 3 & 4) stock adapted to our areas brutal winters.

**Transplanting** adds additional size and root mass to seedlings and cuttings. Transplants are a good choice for smaller plantings where larger plants are desirable.
